SATURATION POINT

MAGMA

Saturation Point was created on the lands of the Wurundjeri people of the Kulin nation. MAGMA Galleries and Drez pay their respects to the traditional owners and custodians of this land. 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As our attention becomes oversaturated with information, collective perceptions shift. How we engage with environments oscillates between influence and intuition. Taking an active role by engaging with information ignites our cognisance, allowing us to see shifting contexts. Saturation Point highlights this agency, harnessing the afterimage to reveal our ability to curate the environment we perceive."

At the heart of Drez's practice sits an apparent contradiction; he is committed, above all, to creating art that embodies egalitarianism; that is accessible to all, no matter the viewer's education, class or culture. At the same time, his work is deeply informed by art history, is developed with conceptual rigour and explores the mechanisms and effects of human visual perception.

Saturation Point marks a new direction in this exploration. Where previously Drez has engaged with light in an indirect way - as the vehicle for our perception and differentiation between colours - this exhibition asks viewers to alter their vision in order to perceive colour differently. This alteration is temporary, lasting only seconds to minutes, but in its fleeting affect, it reveals another key to Drez's practice – his desire to break his subject down into its most basic parts, and to elicit emotion using the minimum materials necessary. In drawing attention to the workings of his practice and inviting us to experiment on ourselves, he achieves maximum accessibility while maintaining the scientific and conceptual drivers behind his work. In fact, in our complicity in this experiment, regardless of our prior art knowledge or comprehension of the reasons for this perceptual shift, we are drawn directly into the conceptual and the experiential. In a sense, this exhibition taps directly into the viewer's brain, to the visual cortex, where colour and light are processed.

Saturation Point is anchored by a series of sculptural works, resembling teleporters from a sci-fi movie, each of which wraps a single-coloured panel of light around an individual viewer. After stepping into its viewing zone and staring into the light for around 90 seconds, we are invited to step away and view the exhibition through a coloured filter, which is created by the afterimage effect. This is the physiological phenomena in which our retinas process intense brightness, and our brains attempt to stabilise our vision – like the experience of walking into a dim room on a sunny day.

Here, Drez has designed and calibrated each light sculpture to encourage a complimentary colour filter to fall over the viewer's eyes. Rather than the dark burn formed in the centre of your vision by the sun or a camera flash, these works' afterimages are a soft alteration, which uniformly veil the field of vision. In the brief aftermath of this experience, our eyes and brains retain the compensatory effects of looking into, for instance, a bright red field of light. Through the resulting inverse, a darkened green, we are invited to then step back and view the exhibition as a whole, experiencing this colour shift across Drez's accompanying paintings.

The Abstract Expressionists were obsessed with breaking painting down into its core elements, and within these basic parameters, they hoped to find the essence of beauty, emotional and

bodily engagement, and to solve the problem of what makes art distinct from other forms of communication. Drez's practice continues this line of enquiry within his contemporary context – building on the immersive impact of his large-scale murals and the bodily response to his portal-like *Chromatic Pulses*, a form that Drez consistently returns to in his work.

The effect of the afterimage is not only in our perception of colour – as it fades and our vision recalibrates, a vibrating movement also inflects Drez's already pulsating paintings. The exhibition includes an installation of rectangular *Chromatic Pulse* paintings, featuring an unexpected range of colours grading from light to dark and back again. The selection of colours that make up these works hints at the infinite possibilities within Drez's practice – colour provides an endlessly generative prime material. There is a suggestion here of a set of oversized sample palettes - a cross section of the unlimited mixes of colour, lightness and gradient available to him. Drez works with colour instinctively, mixing every one of his shades as he works, and meticulously painting all of his work freehand. Through this manual process, he builds artworks of all scales, embedding an imperfection into each painting that is not always immediately apparent. The (very slightly) imperfect painted strips that make up his tonal works create slight visual vibrations, giving these works their pulsating appearance. Drez's *Chromatic Pulses* are often described by viewers as portals – drawing us in to their central focal point and suggesting

an endless hallway into another realm. The suggested movement within these works is further intensified when viewed through the afterimage.

In *Saturation Point*, Drez has continued to deconstruct his practice into its core elements – light, colour, and the viewer's experience. This work is for you, the viewer; it is an opportunity to challenge the reality of your visual perception, to engage with your body, and to witness the impact that art can have on it. Drez wants you to feel this work – both physically and emotionally – to draw out a wordless appreciation of beauty and of your ability to perceive it. For Drez it is not important if you recognise the lineages from which his work stems – it is much more important that he elicits a desire to step closer, a spark of curiosity, and that you experience his work from whichever perspective you come.
